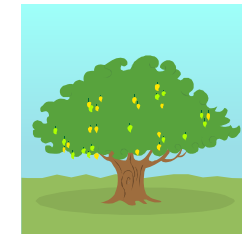
## Friends of Thornton Park

Thornton Park used to have beautiful ornamental gardens of around 15 acres, but after years of neglect they are crying out for some tender loving care.

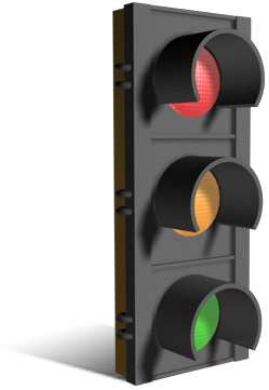
Plans to improve the park have been revealed by a group of volunteers, who want to rediscover some of the history and nature of the 18th century grounds have to offer.
