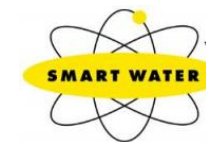

Clarence Avenue/Queens Park Parade Neighbourhood Watch and Cecil Road Neighbourhood Watch areas get access to Smart Water.

Smart Water is a forensic fluid containing millions of microscopic particles that make up an individual property identification code.

The solution is painted onto household items and leaves a forensic fingerprint encoded with the owner's details, which is virtually impossible to remove.
